

# Torrance Refinery Fact Sheet

## Background

- Operations began in 1929
- On July 1, 2016, Torrance Refining Company LLC took control of the Refinery from ExxonMobil Oil Corporation
- Facility covers 750 acres
- Employs 570 employees and 325 contractors
- Employs thousands of California contractors during major maintenance periods known as Turnarounds
- Refines approximately 155,000 barrels of crude oil per day producing about 1.8 billion gallons of gasoline per year

## Distribution

- Produces 20% of gasoline demand in Southern California, 10% of gasoline demand in the entire state
- Refines gasoline for Nevada and Arizona
- Crude transported to the refinery via pipeline from San Joaquin Valley and Port of Los Angeles
- Liquefied petroleum gas, sulfur, and asphalt blendstocks are primarily distributed by tanker truck and railcar
- Gasoline, marine and jet fuels are distributed via pipeline

## Safety and Environment

- Fully-equipped fire department with experienced personnel who regularly train with Torrance Fire Department
- Refinery fire brigade includes professional Fire Fighters, Rescue Specialists, Emergency Medical Technicians, and Hazardous Materials Technicians and Specialists
- Reclaimed water facility treats and reuses water onsite that would otherwise be discharged to the ocean
- Refinery voluntarily accepts and manages the city's overflow storm water during heavy rain to prevent flooding in the city
- Waste management program facilitates reuse, recycling and regeneration
- 24-Hour Neighborhood Hotline (310) 505-3158 responds to neighbors' questions and concerns

## Annual Economic Impact (JULY 2016–JULY 2017)

- \$8.7 million in Property Taxes paid to Los Angeles County
- \$7.5 million in Utility User Tax paid to City of Torrance
- Approximately \$369 million spent in California
  - \$19.3 million spent in the city of Torrance
  - \$113 million spent in employee salaries, wages, and benefits
  - \$237 million spent in state for contractor labor, materials and supplies

## Annual Production

- Gasoline
  - Enough for 7.2 million round-trips from Los Angeles to New York
- Diesel
  - Enough for 1.2 million round-trip truck deliveries Los Angeles to San Francisco
- Jet Fuel
  - Enough to fly 450,000 people around the world
- Liquefied Petroleum Gas
  - Propane to fill 13 million BBQ grill tanks
  - Butane to heat 230,000 camping lanterns
- Other Products
  - Asphalt Blendstocks used for road construction
  - Carbon Dioxide used in soft drinks, medical uses
  - Sulfur used in fertilizer, pharmaceuticals, etc.
