Go indoors immediately; either your home or the nearest building. Bring in pets without risk to yourself.




Choose an inside room with as few windows and doors as possible.

ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS

Cover your nose and mouth with a wet cloth.



Seal windows with duct tape.

Monitor KNX 1070AM or your local TV station for updates.



Wait for an all-clear and follow instructions from local emergency management authorities.
