SHELTER

1

Go indoors immediately; either your home or the nearest building. Bring in pets without risk to yourself.



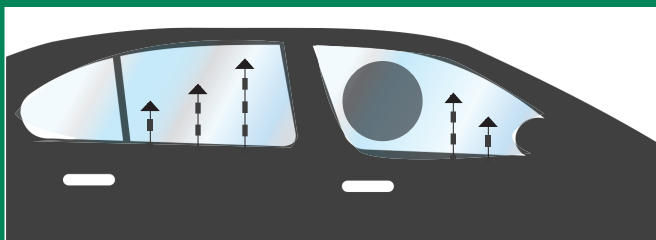
Choose an inside room with as few windows and doors as possible.

Vehicles: close windows and vents, and turn off air conditioning/heating. If driving, continue unless officials say otherwise.

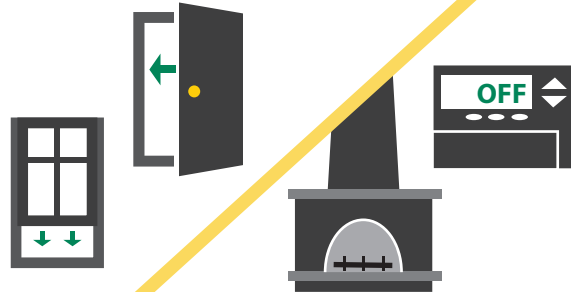


SHUT

SEAL OFF OUTSIDE AIR

Shut all doors and windows.



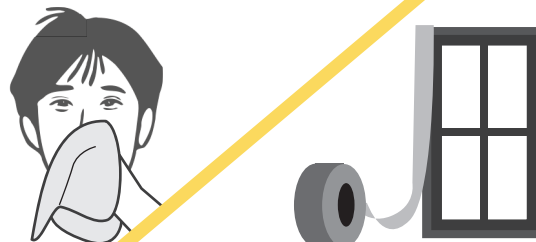
Turn off heaters, air conditioners, ventilation fans, and close fireplace dampers.

ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS

Cover your nose and mouth with a wet cloth.



Seal windows with duct tape.

LISTEN

Monitor KNX 1070AM or your local TV station for updates.



Wait for an all-clear and follow instructions from local emergency management authorities.

Refrain from using your phone to keep lines free for emergency responders.
